Dahlia Gratia Setiyawan is a Ph.D. candidate in the Department of History at the UCLA. Specializing in the history of modern Southeast Asia with a secondary focus in Asian American Studies, her primary research interests involve state surveillance and transnational migration between Indonesia and the United States. Last spring she returned from Surabaya, East Java where, as the recipient of a Fulbright fellowship, she conducted research for her dissertation on state-level monitoring of Indonesians at home and abroad, 1950 – 2010, and was a visiting lecturer in the Airlangga University Department of History. Dahlia has extensively researched, written, and presented on themes related to the urban history of mid-twentieth century Surabaya; her work on this topic has been most recently published in the on-line magazine *Inside Indonesia* and will appear in the forthcoming edited volume, *Kampung Perkotaan: Target Pembangunan atau Daerah yang Ditinggalkan?* (2011).
