Galuh Wandita is ICTJ's Senior Associate, responsible for country programs in Indonesia and Timor-Leste since 2006. Over the last two decades, she has worked with several local human rights organizations in East Timor and Indonesia. Before moving to East Timor in 1999, she worked for 10 years with Oxfam, focusing on support for local NGOs working in conflict areas in Eastern Indonesia (Nusa Tenggara Timur, East Timor [then part of Indonesia], Papua, and Kalimantan), with a focus on gender approach to development. She is a founding member of the women's organization, Fokupers, in Timor-Leste, established in 1997. In 1999, she worked with East Timorese human rights NGOs, during the crisis around the ballot, monitoring the human rights situation, providing support for internally displaced persons (IDP's) and women victims of violence. In 2000, she worked as a human rights officer for the United Nations in East Timor, and in 2002 was appointed as the Deputy Director / Program Manager of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (CAVR). After 2003, she continued as Program Manager, and later on joined the Editorial Team for the writing of the Commission's Final Report. She obtained a BA in Anthropology from Swarthmore College in 1988, and completed a Masters in International Human Rights Law from Oxford University in 2007.
